#### **BTG PROJECT UPDATE**

NOV 2022

On the 5th of November, the community representatives came together for the 4th time to discuss on the project notes from the 3rd round of family dinner visits and to understand the solutions for the issues identified from the eight families. This meeting was led by the two group facilitators, Prof. Dory, and Stewart.

At the end of Stage 3 of this project, facilitators, Community Representatives, and families gathered together to look at the draft outcomes of this project, draft solutions for the issues identified and to identify any additional issues which were not mentioned in the draft outcomes. All of the community representatives and most of the families were present at the final gathering of 2022. It was a successful gathering where the summary of the draft outcomes of the project (stage 3) was presented and understood by the participants of this BtG project. This meeting was held on the 26th of November at Fickling Convention Centre.

#### **COMMUNITY CASE IMPACT**

Mrs. F and family came to New Zealand through RQP from Syria in 2016. Since they arrived here in NZ, they were assigned to live in Porirua Wellington. During their stay, someone broke into their house, so they moved to another social housing in Wellington City in 2020. After that, they moved to their current social housing in Avondale, Auckland. They are having problems with the neighbours regards to parking issue at this current house. They also do not feel safe in this neighbourhood as there are fights going on involving guns and knives. They have reported to the police several times regards to the parking issue. The police came and asked the neighbours to move their car. Thus, they applied for housing transfer back to Wellington 2 years ago. At first their application sits in A20 priority but was moved down to A18. They met and discussed with their Tenancy Manager, but they were advised to look for the private rental. ARCC Community Support Coordinator and Community Support Worker worked closely with the family to provide the housing and WINZ related problems which they are facing. ARCC wrote a support letter regards to the housing transfer to WINZ and local MP office. Community Support Worker was constantly in touch with the Housing Assessment Unit in MSD. After the officer from the housing assessment unit in MSD visited Mrs. F's house to do the assessment for their house transfer, their case has been transferred to Wellington and they are looking for a suitable house for them. A few days later, Mrs. F and her family have been given a social housing in Porirua, Wellington. They are very happy about this and thankful to ARCC as they believe this process has been faster due to ARCC Support Letter.


