
# Youth United Voice

## Learning Communities Hub: 1st session – Overview of New Zealand Education System

A representative from the Ministry of Education led the presentation, with community volunteers providing interpretation. The session covered an overview of the New Zealand Education System, which is crucial for parents to understand.



## Bridging the Gap (BtG): SDWG Meeting Update

The Solution Development Working Group (SDWG) had a meeting on 25th March, marking the conclusion of their six-month volunteering period dedicated to developing tools. ARCC extends its sincere appreciation to every member of the SDWG for dedicating their time, knowledge, energy, and

unwavering commitment to participating in Phase 2 of the Bridging the Gap Project. The report, along with two practical tools, will be officially launched on 1st June 2024.

### Meet2Connect

During the meeting, we engaged in meaningful discussions aimed at understanding the diverse areas of support offered by various organisations. By actively participating in such networking meetings, ARCC aims to foster collaboration, share knowledge, and strengthen partnerships with other service providers.



### Eid Celebration Stall at Eden Park

This year, ARCC had the opportunity to set up a stall, connecting with the community and increasing ARCC's visibility. The stall served as a platform to share information about ARCC's programmes and the upcoming Learning Communities Hub.



## ARCC Meeting with MP (Dr Parmjeet)

Our CEO, Abann, and Marketing & Communications Manager, Ehsan, had the privilege of meeting with our local MP, Dr. Parmjeet. She came to our doorstep looking to reconnect with ARCC and to see how to engage with local community issues. It was a positive meeting as the outcome was that she is willing to provide employment support in the resettlement sector. Abann even briefly talked about the Bridging the Gap project, giving her updates and explaining the process of the project itself. Dr. Parmjeet expressed strong admiration for the project, and she offered opportunities for ARCC to present the Bridging the Gap project to different political parties to garner support. We hope to collaborate more with her soon.





### **Community Consultation Meetings**

Our community engagement with the Executive Committee (EC) aims to identify leadership gaps within the EC, ensuring a better understanding of their leadership capabilities within the organisation/community. This initiative equips the EC with specialised capability development to make meaningful contributions to their community/organisation.

The outcomes of this engagement include a better understanding of the frameworks of incorporated societies and organisational structures, familiarity with roles and responsibilities, and clearly identified areas for capacity building in leadership practices such as management, communication, problem-solving, negotiation, meeting facilitation, leadership management, strategic thinking, and relationship building. We have conducted a total of eight consultation meetings with various community organisations under the umbrella of ARCC.
